163/25	Public Forum (Including update from Clean Earth Energy – Proposed Turbine Development Plans):- Two members of public in attendance with nothing to raise.	
	Update from Clean Earth Energy – Proposed Turbine Development Plans:-Dean Robson and Amber Trenberth reported Clean Earth have erected 4 turbines in the clay area. They had issues with the airport, with restrictions on further development. They have secured planning for a further 5 turbines next year, and they are bigger than the ones currently at Victoria and will probably be the biggest in the South West. There is scope for a further turbine in Roche near Hensbarrow Beacon. The purpose tonight is to outline thoughts and invite comments when Councillors have discussed and reviewed. Chairman said this was very clear and asked when the build would start. This would be June/July next year. Others apart from the proposed Roche will be in St. Stephen and Treverbyn. The percentage of turbine revenue should be at least £12,500.00 a year equating to 2% which is the same as all other new turbines in the area. Life expectancy is 37 years. It would take about 85 acres of solar panels to cover one turbine. Chairman suggested all Councillors put all points and questions for the Clerk to forward on Action: Councillors/Clerk.	CIIrs/ Clerk

Heard back today, and the highway drainage design is in progress, due to a required change. Further update received from Cornwall Council, who were informed last week that some verge and kerbing works are due to start, possibly this week. However, the CCTV drainage survey is with Mace and WSP to look at further drainage design. It appears that the drainage in the area is damaged and requires replacement. Therefore, they have discussed with me the work and road space booking until August/September. There is no point in erecting a new bus shelter, only to find that the levels are different, and the drainage requires excavations near a new bus shelter Action: Keep Pending for an update, keeping Cornwall Councillor S.
