- Utterly pointless as the amount of cars would still be the same
- Make the centre of Roche HGV free
- Pavements need to be introduced and a new lower speed limit
- · Road to the east would free up Bugle as well
- Railway bridge will need to be strengthened if HGVs continue

Is it worth building an additional 200 homes if there is no other option to get a bypass?

Comments

- 200 is a lot but may be the only way forward
- Only 3-5 new houses in each development should be allowed
- The bypass needs to happen before the new homes
- 200 homes would need a new school and a lot more shops
- Not ideal but possible
- 200 is far too many
- New bypass should not be dependent on new houses
- A new bypass would not fit
- It is a way of blackmail to get more housing in Roche
- New housing fine provided traffic is taken out of Roche
- School needs to be extended before 200 houses go in
- We shouldn't be blackmailed

- We need more landscaping so that Roche is a more attractive place to live
- More housing would create a higher rate of unemployment in the area
- Pelican crossings and double yellow lines needed
- Speed bumps needed
- Even with a bypass there is still a need for traffic calming measures in the village
