HOMES

According to Cornwall Council, between 2010 and 2030 around 150-300 new homes will be needed in Roche Parish. However, 240 have already been permitted since 2010. So whilst Roche Neighbourhood Plan can propose more, on Cornwall Council's figures only 3-5 new homes are now required here on average each year to 2030.


A SELECTION OF YOUR COMMENTS...

"Roche is turning into a large housing estate. Most new builds have no character, just square boxes. "I think Roche is overcrowded". "Roche Village is becoming more like a town".

YOU CHOSE

- You overwhelmingly said that unless heavy traffic through Roche is cut, and enough school places made available, housing development should be limited.
- You preferred smaller scale developments and you strongly want key heritage protected, including Roche Rock, the Glebe Meadow, and the Old Fairground.
- You want a mix of homes, and support self-build plots being made available. Some housing development at Victoria has support if more homes are needed.
- The map below shows some sites in red where you definitely DON'T want development.
- Views were mixed on the sites hatched blue (but in all cases you prefer smaller scale development - not the whole of larger sites)
- Yellow sites are possible infill sites suggested since the survey.

Your priorities for better leisure services were more green spaces accessible for all, and more facilities for teenagers.

2nd - 29% - More facilities for teenagers.

3rd - 12% - Community allotments.

4th - 10% - More for the elderly

5th - 7% - Funding for sports facilities

6th - 7% - More children's play equipment.

TRAFFIC

Traffic was by far the major issue in your comments. You don't want more development until it is reduced.

You believe that before more development is allowed, the Council should complete the proposed A30-St. Austell link road to reduce traffic through Roche.

You strongly agree we must require developers building alongside the main road through Trezaise and Roche Village to first provide good pavements linking their site to the village centre – and to Victoria, if the development is along Victoria Road.
