THE SERVICE

GATHERING (All gather in silence)

The presiding minister reads one or more of the following sentences:

God is our refuge and strength; a very present help in trouble. Psalm 46.1

I lift up my eyes to the hills – from whence will my help come My help comes from the Lord, Who made heaven and earth. Psalm 121.1-2
