Archeological Day- Thursday July 7th 2022- Roche Victory Hall 12pm-8pm.

Prior to the main scheme construction works, Alun Griffiths commissioned WSP and Cornwall Archeological Unit to carry out the specialist archeological works. The findings uncovered during the works were more extensive than originally anticipated, and cover a wide historical period throughout Cornish history.

The most significant finds uncovered include a rare Neolithic Longhouse of National significance within which various items were uncovered including a hand axe. There was also evidence of a Bronze age funerary landscape, and an Iron age Roundhouse. Throughout the site various Roman features were identified which are likely to be from just after the Roman invasion, one of which was a Roman Legionary Marching Camp where various potteries were discovered.

Along with these significant finds, evidence was discovered of medieval farming and mining activities – both early signs of traditional Cornish industries!

We would like to invite local residents, local businesses, schools and members of the public to our open event on the 7th July to showcase this. Cornwall Archaeological Unit will be present on the day and will be able to discuss in detail the history and present to you what they have found. Please come along to Roche Victory Hall on the 7th July for a drop in event between 12pm to 8pm to discover some local history that has been discovered in your area.

Considerate Constructors Scheme



The project has been registered with the Considerate Constructors Scheme which aims to improve the image of our industry.

We will be monitored and scored by an independent assessor against this Code. The results will identify good practice and areas for improvement. We shall have approximately two inspections yearly and will share the results in future newsletters.
